

THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW...

Additional Registrations

If you need to use an emergency for more than three matches, or want to replace a player, you will need to register them by calling your Competition Delegate. Make sure you find out their previous experience and leave two weeks for the NSNTA to process the request. Until the registration is confirmed, the player must play no more than three matches. You will lose any games they win in any subsequent matches if they play.

Note: Additional Registrations close after Round 10.

Team Fees

All players are required to pay team fees, to cover lighting and tennis balls and amenities provided by the club. These will be added to the player's account. Failure to pay within a reasonable timeframe will result in a player not being eligible to continue playing.

Supper

All players must bring supper to every home match.

The Club will now ensure Milk, Tea and Coffee is available to all players for the various evenings. The BBQ is available for use.

A lot of members call the local Pizza Shop – Paladinos Pizza, as they offer delivery.

Keys

If you get down to the club and it is locked up, don't panic!

Refer to **Court Opening and Closing Guide**. If you are aware in advance there will be no one with keys at the club on the night, make prior arrangements with the above people to avoid embarrassment!

Balls

Tennis balls used on the night of a match should be placed in the box near the fridge.

Please write your grade and the date on the top of the can.

Wet balls should be left out on the bench under the honour board to dry.

Starting times

Matches start at 7pm, and should get under way no later than 7:15pm. Any sets taking place on courts 3-6 after 11pm should be moved to courts 1 & 2.

Rules

Any disputes with the opposition regarding regulations should be checked against the rulebook, located at the back of the fixture. If no resolution is made, please contact a member of the NSNTA match and permit committee whose names and numbers are on the fixture. They will usually make a ruling immediately. Never agree to a decision by the opposition until it is confirmed by either the rulebook or a member of the NSNTA match and permit committee. If doubt remains, play on and allow the opposition to lodge a protest.

Each member of the team should receive a fixture with rules listed for competition play.

Code Of Conduct

Westmeadows Tennis Club encourages sportsmanlike behaviour and endorses the Code of Conduct promulgated by Tennis Australia.

People using the facilities provided by the Club, both members and visitors, are encouraged to demonstrate appropriate conduct on and of the tennis court.

Acceptable conduct is embodied by:

- Use of appropriate language whilst on the premises.
- Playing competitive tennis using best efforts to win.
- Maintaining good relations with opposition team members.
- Resolving disputes on court promptly and without fuss.
